

CZERNIAWSKI AND BRUNSWICK CHARGE TO VICTORY

Dave 'Choppa' Czerniawski combined brilliantly with last minute partner Dave Brunswick to score 46 points and win the Challenge Chemicals 4BBB contested last Saturday.
