The 'Big G' played the par fives two under, with impressive birdies on the opening holes of each nine. Williams had two shots wiped from his handicap, with the CCR being 73, and will watch with interest, along with many others, to see where the dust settles when the long awaited handicap changes are finalised tomorrow.

Leigh Bernardi parred the course to take gross honours as well as the runner up spot with 22 points.
